3. Completing this form helps us place your company in the proper division, provides contact information, and helps give us an **estimate** of how many events your company may participate in. It does not lock your company into any of the events.
4. To register a team for a specific event, complete the confirmation form for that specific event. You can enter multiple teams in all events. Some events have the option of registering partial teams. Just circle the categories of participation for these events to register partial teams. **E-mail** the completed confirmation form to me. When I receive your confirmation form your team(s) will be officially registered. **Registration dues will not be returned if you are unable to field the team(s) the week of the event.**

Corporate Challenge General Information

1. Entry Procedure

Entries will be processed on a first-come, first-serve basis until tournaments are filled. Although entry deadlines are usually about two weeks prior to each event companies are encouraged to enter early, as tournaments fill quickly. If entries remain, a team will be assigned an entry position when the following condition is met two weeks prior to each event:

- The YMCA of Central Ohio must receive all entry fees and confirmation by 5:00 p.m. on the designated dates. Unless your company has made other arrangements with the YMCA of Central Ohio.

2. Entry Waiting List

Limits on number of team entries for event are listed in each *Event Description*. If entry limits are reached prior to the entry deadline for that event, a waiting list will be established by order of entry fee receipt.

- Late entries will be placed on the *Entry Waiting List* and assessed a \$10.00 late fee, if accepted into the tournament.

Note: Any company who officially enters a team in an event and then cancels out their team the week of the event, will forfeit all entry fees.

4. Corporate Challenge Company Representative

It is extremely important that each company identify an official **Corporate Challenge Representative**. This person will be the major contact for all Corporate Challenge communications, including tournament results and President's Cup point updates. This contact person is critical to the tasks of communicating information to employees, and organizing the company's efforts in this multi-event challenge. Often, this individual will assume the administrative and organizational responsibilities and will designate other employees to assume team captain or coordinator roles in each event. Regardless of the division of labor, it is important to clearly designate the official company contact to ensure efficient communication. Multiple site companies may request information be sent to the various sites simultaneously. Requests for information from the YMCA should only come from this person(s). Information regarding specific events should be directed to the specific Tournament Directors.

5. Tournament Structure and Bracket Draw

In all bracket sports (i.e., Table Tennis, Softball and Billiards) teams will be placed on the first round brackets by random draws. When time and facility resources allow, double elimination tournaments will be designed. The schedule or bracket posted at the event will always be the *Official Schedule* –

6. Amateur Status

The Corporate Challenge is an amateur event. The rules defining professional status in each sport as determined by a Governing Body (chosen by the Tournament Director) for that sport will be used in questions of eligibility.

7. Employee Eligibility

All competitors must be employees of the company entered. An individual is considered to be an eligible employee if he/she is pay-rolled for at least one month on a full or part-time basis.

An eligible company is one which has a location situated in the Central Ohio area. Central Ohio is defined as the contiguous counties of Franklin, Union, Delaware, Licking, Madison, Pickaway and Fairfield. A location that participated prior to January 1, 1995 remains eligible.

Retirees are eligible. They should be able to produce an insurance card or a pension check stub if questioned about their association with a particular company.

NEW update 12/3/2015: Interns and Temp contract workers are now eligible.

NEW update 12/8/2017: Spouse of employee are now eligible to participate at the discretion and responsibility of employee employer.

Captains must sign-off on all rosters verifying that all team members are company employee, retiree, intern or spouse.

Each competitor must bring a pictured personal I.D. with a recent payroll stub (within two months) or, preferably, a pictured company I.D. if available. **The YMCA no longer assumes any responsibility for checking identification of employees on the day of a contest.** This is entirely the responsibility of the opposing captains if they desire to exercise this option. If a player is challenged by an opposing Captain and cannot produce valid I.D. as described above, the opposing Captain has the right to request the YMCA Site Official or Tournery Director to approve that player's ineligibility from competing. The verifying of I.D.'s by opposing Captains can only occur during a regularly scheduled break in the action (between innings, quarters, halftime, etc.). Play will not be stopped for this reason.

Captains are strongly encouraged to impose this "self-check" before the contest begins. Teams losing a player after play has begun because of improper I.D. will not be penalized at that time. That individual simply becomes ineligible to continue. If further investigation proves that individual to be an ineligible company employee, then the following penalties may be assessed:

- A. Forfeiture of tournament.
- B. Loss of any President's Cup points earned by any team in the tournament from that company.
- C. An additional 25 President's Cup point penalty.

Any complaints about player eligibility must be registered with the Tournament Director during the event: The YMCA will initiate an investigation of a player only if a

complaint is registered the day of the event. It is up to the discretion of the Tournament Director to decide whether any given complaint should be investigated.

8. "No-Show" Forfeit and Penalty

Any team which is not ready to play at its scheduled to playing time (within the stipulated grace period for each tournament, usually 5 minutes from start) will forfeit that game. If that forfeited game is their first game of the tournament, they will be permitted to play, but will be placed in the *LOSERS Bracket* when possible. Any forfeit occurring in the bracket eliminates the team. In addition, a penalty of five President's Cup point will be assessed against a company **each time** any one of the company's teams flagrantly fails to notify the Tournament Official prior to the end of the grace period in all bracket sports. A phone call to the Tournament Director is sufficient notification.

9. Individual Entry Limitation

10. Unsportsmanlike-like Conduct

Any incident which involves intentional physical contact resulting in the ejection of the player(s) involved (decision of ejection is the referees or umpires) means that said player(s) are out for the remainder of that sporting tournament **without replacement** for that game. A second incidence of intentional physical contact will mean that the entire team for which said player(s) competes will be ejected from the tournament with refund or participation points.

An ejected player assessed an intentional flagrant foul, must leave the facility (5) minutes following the official's call. If that player does not leave, the team is then disqualified from the tournament.

All other incidents of unsportsmanlike-like conduct which results in an official ejecting a player(s) will require that the player(s) be out for one game/match on the first incident and out for the remainder of the tournament on the second incident, both times **without replacement**.

Again the decision as to which of the two above categories an incident falls under is the sole decision of the referee/official and/or Tournament Director.

11. Injury Occurrence and Ejections

A team will be allowed to "play short" if injuries or ejections have limited the amount of available players. The team must, however, field a proper team in order for play to begin initially. Certain gender ratios may still be enforced in some co-ed sports.

Scoring

1. Scoring for the President's Cup Awards

The President's Cup Awards will be presented to the top 3 overall companies/organizations in the competitive events in each of the three size divisions. The following is an outline of the overall scoring for the President's Cup and Awards:

- A. All participating corporations will receive participation points for each event in which they participate. *Five points maximum per event will be awarded to a corporation regardless of the number of teams entered.*
- B. The following points will be awarded to all participating corporations at the end of each of the sports events based on their place of finish within their size division.

1 st - 25	6 th - 14
2 nd - 22	7 th - 12
3 rd - 20	8 th - 10
4 th - 18	9 th - 8
5 th - 16	10 th - 6

- C. Corporations entering more than one team in an event can only score President's Cup points for the highest placing team.
- D. In determination of President's Cup points, teams (in the same size division) who finish an event in a tie will receive the same number of points based on the place of the finish. For example, if two (2) Division I teams tie for third place, the following President's Cup points will be awarded for placing in the event.

1 st - 25	5 th - 16
2 nd - 22	6 th - 14
3 rd - 20	etc..
3 rd - 20	
4 th - 18	

2. Tournament Scoring

- A. , volleyball, soccer, and softball will be scored as outlined in 1-C.
- B. , table tennis , tennis, , cornhole & horseshoes will be scored within each category (i.e. men's singles, women's single, doubles. Scoring will be one plus the number of participants in each category, per division (i.e. 13 women competing in women's singles, first place would bring in 14 points toward the team score). All participants will now be contributing points to the total team score. Once team points are totaled, overall tournament places will be announced and President's Cup points awarded.
- C. The triathlon participants first will be stratified into their respective division and then scored by rank order of finish by entries in two categories, individual and relay. The two categories will then be added together for an overall score. If there is a tie, the overall times of the individual and relay will be added together.

Golf and bowling will be scored by the team that turns in the best event score. Ties will be broken based upon that events regulations and rules. Divisions will be immediately separated.

Golf Y Cup will be awarded to the top two scores for the company that sends at least a team to both events. Only first place for each division will be awarded.

3. Team Confirmation

The team confirmation form is to accompany the entry fee for the following events: ALL EVENTS.

4. Other Rosters

Other rosters are due with the fee entry for these events: bowling, & triathlon, etc. This must be a finalized roster. All other rosters are due as outlined above.

2018 Table Tennis Rules

U.S.T.T.A. "Laws of Table Tennis" will govern play with the following:

1. Each match will be 3 out of 5 games to 11 points; must win by 2 points. All matches are 25 minutes in length. Semifinal and final rounds will have a 45 minute time limit.
2. On service, the ball must be contacted in the air. The ball cannot be hidden before contact.
3. In singles, the serve must contact the server's side then the receiving side.
3. In doubles, the serve will always be from the right side of the court to the opposite side of the receiving court.
5. Doubles teams will rotate into service position to receive. (Rotate after serving)
6. For doubles and singles, the serve will rotate teams every 2 serves.
7. Doubles teams must alternate hits after service.
8. All players must wear non-corresponding colors with orange ball.
8. Sand paddles will not be permitted. Individuals are encouraged to provide their own paddles. The YMCA will have paddles available to those that need them in exchange for a valid driver's license.
10. There will be NO smoking or alcohol permitted.
10. Captains are responsible to make sure players are on time at the designated table and ready to play.
11. Each match winner is responsible to report scores to the scorer's table immediately after the match.
12. If time runs out and it is 2 games apiece, then players alternate serves until a 2 point advantage is established by a player.
13. A Forfeit / Scratch is considered a win and the opposing team is awarded 11-0, 11-0, 11-0 for the match.
15. Players tied at 10 will alternate serves until a two point advantage is obtained.
16. The player(s) who started at one end of the table in a game shall start at the other end in the next game and so on until the end of the match.
17. In the fifth game, the player(s) shall change ends when first player or pair reaches a score of 5.

Corporate Challenge 2018 Dodgeball Rules

PLEASE BRING EMPLOYEE / COMPANY ID!!

1. Teams will be made up of 6-10 players. At least 2 female and 2 male must start each game. Six (6) players will compete on a side; others will be available as substitutes. Substitutes may enter the game only in the case of injury.
2. A game can begin with four (4) players with at least 2 being Female/male. The opposing team can still put a full team on the court. They will not have to play a man or two down or match the partial team.
3. During each game, teams will play for the entire 18 minutes; once a team eliminates all members of the opposing team, the winning team will be awarded 1 point. After the point is awarded, both teams will begin a new match. The two teams will play with this format for the duration of the 18 minutes. At the end of the 18 minutes the team with the most points with the match. If the two teams have the same number of points at the end of the 18 minutes, there will be a sudden death. One player from each team is chosen and 3 balls are lined up on center line; all other game rules are in force. Both players are permitted to advance to quarter line; first player to get the other participant out will win the match.
4. Time clock will be a running clock. Clock will stop only for injuries.
5. The object of the game is to eliminate all opposing players by getting them "OUT". This may be done by:
 - A. Hitting an opposing player with a LIVE thrown ball below the shoulders.
 - B. A thrower's attempt is caught by the opposing player. This also allows one member of the catcher's team to rejoin the game.
 - C. You are out if you step past the end line while attempting to either catch or dodge a ball.
 - D. You are out if you cross the middle line.

Definition: LIVE: A ball that has been thrown and has not touched anything, including the floor/ground, another ball, another player, official or other items outside of the playing field (wall, ceiling, etc.)

6. If you are out:
 - A. Exit from the side line.
 - B. You may retrieve balls for their team from behind the end line. You are not allowed to stand on the sides of the courts and throw/kick or retrieve balls.
7. Boundaries
During play, all players must remain within the boundary lines. Players may leave the boundaries through their end-line only to retrieve stray balls. They must also return through their end-line.
8. The game will start on the Officials signal.
9. Games will begin by placing the dodge balls along the center line – four (4) on one side of the center hash and four (4) on the other. Players then take a position behind their end line. Following a signal by the official, teams may approach the centerline to retrieve the balls. This signal officially starts the contest. Teams may only retrieve the four (4) balls to their right of the center hash. Once a ball is retrieved it must be taken behind the attack-line before it can be legally thrown.
10. In order to reduce stalling, a violation will be called if a team in the lead controls half or majority of the balls on their side of the court for more than 10 seconds. This also applies to tied teams.
11. There will be a five (5) minutes grace period for the start of each game. Teams not ready to play by the end of this period will forfeit the game.

**Please note these rules can change before the start of the tournament.*

PLEASE BRING EMPLOYEE / COMPANY I.D. !!

The YMCA Corporate Challenge Billiards Tournament will be governed by rules adapted from the APA and in some instances may vary slightly. This handout is condensed version of the APA rule book.

- 1. Type of Game:** Eight Ball (often called "stripes and solids")
In this game, players must legally pocket seven balls of one group and then legally pocket the eight ball; or pocket the eight ball on a legal break.
- 2. Players:** Singles and **Choice Doubles**
- 3. Balls Used:** Standard set of object balls numbered 1-15, plus a cue ball; or bi-colored balls (seven each of two colors) plus cue ball and eight ball.
- 4. The Rack:** All balls should be frozen (touching) as tightly as possible. The balls are racked with the 1-ball on the foot spot and the 8-ball in the center.
- 5. Object of Game:** To legally pocket all the balls of either group 1-7 (One color) or 9-15 (the other color), and then the 8-ball. **The time limit is 20 minutes per game with a 5 minute intermission between games. The final rounds will be the best 2 out of 3 games with an hour time limit. All other rounds will be single games.**
- 6. Scoring:** Group balls have no point value. The player legally pocketing 8-ball is credited with a game won. If time runs out, then the person with the most pocketed balls wins. Scoring is based upon the number of balls pocketed plus three bonus points for pocketing the 8-ball. Total score would be 10 points. If time runs out, the least amount of balls on the table will decide the winner. In case of a tie, each person will attempt a shot. If one shot is made and the other is missed, then the game is over. If both make their shots, they would continue until a missed shot or the 8-ball is pocketed.
- 7. Forfeit/Scratch:** A teams forfeiture or scratch from the tournament gives the opponent the win and a score of 10 points. (3 for the 8-ball, plus their 7 balls on the table.)
- 8. Opening Break:** To be a legal break, players must break from behind the head string, the head ball or second ball must be struck first and at least 4 object balls must be driven to the rails or a ball must be pocketed. The cue ball may not be shot into a rail before the rack. If the break does not qualify as legal, the balls are reracked and broken by the same player. If the break does not qualify as legal and results in a scratch, the balls are reracked and broken by the opposite player. A foul on a legal break results in ball-in-hand for the opponent behind the head string.
- 9. Determination of Groups:** If you hit in one or more balls of the same group, you must take that group. If more balls are pocketed from one group than the other, the table remains open and that person may shoot at any of the available object balls.
Example: If two solids and one stripe are made on the break, the table is still open and the shooter has their choice of stripes or solids.
- 10. Rules of Play:**
 - A. A legally pocketed ball of a players' group (a ball of either group when the table is open) entitles the shooter to continue at the table until they fail to pocket on a legal shot. After all balls of the group are pocketed, the player shoots to pocket the 8-ball.
 - B. If the 8-ball is pocketed on a legal opening break shot, the person breaking wins the game. 10 points will be awarded to the person breaking if the 8-ball is pocketed on

the opening break. **If the person breaking pockets the 8-ball and scratches they lose the game.**

- C. Combination shots involving balls of both groups are legal when the table is open. After groups are determined, player must cause the cue ball's first contact to be with a ball of their own group. Failure to do so results in ball-in-hand situation for your opponent. **The 8-ball is not neutral.**
- D. Ball-in-hand- you are allowed to place the cue-ball anywhere on the table (with the exception of a scratch on the break which results in ball-in-hand behind the head string) and shoot any of your balls. The ball-in-hand rule penalizes a player for an error.

Here are the fouls which results in ball-in-hand:

- 1. Anytime the cue ball goes in a pocket, on the floor, or otherwise ends up off the playing surface.
 - 2. Failure to hit your object ball first. The 8-ball is neutral.
 - 3. Failure to hit a rail after contact. Any ball (including the cue ball) must go to the rail after legal contact. A pocketed ball counts as a rail.
 - 4. The object ball is frozen to a rail and the player is contemplating a "safety". In order for the "frozen ball" rule to be in effect, the opponent must declare the ball frozen and the player should verify. Once it is agreed the ball is frozen the player must drive the object ball to another rail (of course, it could hit another ball, which in turn hits a rail) or drive the cue ball to a rail after it touches the object ball.
 - 5. It is a foul to jump a cue ball over another ball by purposely miscuing it up in the air.
 - 6. Causing movement of the cue ball, even accidentally is a foul.
 - 7. If, during the course of a shot, the cue ball does not touch anything it is a foul.
 - 8. Use caution when picking up or placing the cue ball in a ball-in-hand situation. The cue ball is always alive. If the cue ball, or the hand that is holding or moving it, touches another ball it is a cue ball foul and your opponent has ball-in-hand.
 - 9. There are no coaching time-outs. **This is different from standard APA rules.** You are allowed to talk and discuss shots but when it is your turn to shoot you must be ready to do so.
- E. The eight ball may not be legally pocketed unless, prior to the shot, the shooting player places the pocket marker on the desired pocket into which they are playing the 8-ball. Designate only the pocket, indicating details such as cushions, banks, kisses, carom, etc. is not necessary.

11. Loss of Game: A player losses the game if they commit any of the following infractions:

- A. Pockets the 8-ball on an illegal or fouled opening break.
- B. Pockets the 8-ball when it is not their legal object ball.
- C. Pockets the 8-ball on the same stroke as their last group ball(s).
- D. Scratches when the 8-ball is their legal object ball.
- E. Jumps the 8-ball off the table at any time during the game.
- F. Pockets the 8-ball in a pocket other than the one designated.

12. Illegally Pocketed Balls: Not spotted. No penalty unless the illegally pocketed ball is the 8-ball, in which case, the penalty is loss of game.

13. Inadvertent Moves: Causing movement of the cue ball, even accidentally, is a foul. It is not a foul to move any other balls. Any balls moved accidentally during a shot must be replaced by the opponent after the shot is over and the balls have stopped rolling. If, it occurs before the shot, it must be replaced by the opponent before the shot is taken.

1. General Rules

- A. A team consists of 4 participants (Men's/Women's Singles and A Choice Doubles Team).
- B. All matches will be CRICKET WITH POINTS.
- C. Best 2 out of 3 will constitute a match.
- D. Matches will be 25 minutes in length with a 5 minute break in between matches. The championship matches will have a 1 hour time limit.
- E. A coin toss will determine who throws the bull first. Closest to the bull's eye will determine the starting thrower.
- F. The thrower must mark their score before removing the darts from the dart board.
- G. Player(s) winning 2 out of the 3 games will automatically advance as the winner.
- H. Tie breaking criteria:
 - 1) Game 1 still in progress:
 - a. Player with more total closeouts.
 - b. Player with more total points.
 - c. A cumulative score after a 3 dart throw.
 - 2) If only 1 full game is completed, regardless of who is winning game 2, the winner of game 1 advances.
 - 3) 2 games completed (3rd game has NOT started)
 - a. Player(s) with more total closeouts from games 1 and 2.
 - b. If players are tied in closeouts, a cumulative score after a 3 dart throw will determine the winner.
 - 4) 3rd game started (the first two games do not apply to the tie breaking criteria).
 - a. Player(s) with more total closeouts in game 3.
 - b. Player(s) with more total points in game 3.
 - c. If still tied after A & B, a cumulative score after a three dart throw will determine the winner.
- I. Forfeit/Scratches/Byes - a player(s) will be awarded the match (2 games) and 14 closeouts.
- J. Player(s) are responsible for scoring and reporting scores to the main scoring table.
- K. A score sheet must be completed and signed by both players.
- L. Team roster must be turned in before the start of the tournament
- M. Once the match has started, no participant will be allowed to leave the throwing area.

2. YMCA Tournament Rules (Cricket: With Points)

- A. The object is to "close" numbers 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 and bulls (cork) and to score more points than your opponent. The player which closes all numbers

- first and scores a greater or equal number of points is the winner. A team or player may win by closing all numbers if neither team has scored points.
- B. In order to "close" a number, a player or team must hit three of that number. For the purpose of closing and scoring, the double and triple rings shall count as 2 and 3 respectively of each number. The inner bull counts as 2 bulls.
 - C. After closing a number, a team or player may score in that number until the opponent also closes it. When both sides have closed a number, no more scoring may occur in that number.
 - D. All number scores are added to the previous balance.

 - F. Numbers may be closed in any order.

I. General Rules

- A. A team consists of 6 participants (Men's/Women's Doubles and Choice Doubles).
- B. The time limit is 35 minutes per game with a 5-minute intermission between games. The consolation and final rounds will be the best 2 out of 3 games with an hour and ten minutes time limit. All other rounds will be single games.
- C. Tie breaking criteria:
 - 1) Game 1 in progress:
 - a. Team with more total points.
 - b. Winner of the next hand (hand consists of playing all five tricks).
 - 2) If only 1 full is completed, regardless of who is winning game 2, the winner of game 1 advances.
 - 3) 2 games completed (3rd game has NOT started)
 - a. Team with most cumulative points from games 1 and 2.
 - b. If teams are tied, winner of the next hand.
 - 4) 3rd game started (the first two games do not apply to the tie breaking criteria).
 - a. Team with more total points in game 3.
 - b. Winner of the next hand.
- D. Forfeit/Scratches/Byes – Players will advance to the next game.
- E. Player(s) are responsible for scoring and reporting scores to the main scoring table.
- F. Team roster must be turned in before the start of the tournament.

II. YMCA Euchre Tournament Rules

- A. Partners face across from each other.
- B. Cards – From a regular deck remove the 2-8 cards from each suit. There are 24 cards in the euchre deck. The highest card in the deck is the trump suit jack (called the right bower). The second highest card is the other jack of the same color (left bower). The rest of the trump cards follow in order of strength – A, K, Q, 10, 9. For non trump suits the order of rank is A, K, Q, J (if not left bower) 10, 9.
- C. Deal –
 - 1) Cards will be dealt around the table, first black jack will deal. After each hand is played, the deal passes clockwise around the table.
 - 2) The player who deals must, according to etiquette, offer a cut to the opponent to his right. A legal cut consists of no less than four cards.
 - 3) The dealer should always deal to the opponent to his left first, then proceed clockwise around the table. Each player receives five cards dealt in batches of 3-2 or 2-3 (Alternate between the two teams). The top card of the remaining cards (called the kitty) is turned face up on the table (called the turn-up). The remaining cards of the kitty, are set to the side.
- D. Making –
 - 1) The turn-up proposes the trump suit for that deal, but it becomes trump only if some player accepts it. Beginning with the player at the left of the dealer, each player in turn may pass or may accept the suit as the turn-up until it has been accepted by one of the players.
 - 2) If all four players pass, then the turn-up is faced down. Then each in turn to the left of the dealer has a second chance to pass or to name a trump suit (if none has been named ahead of him). The named trump suit must be different from the turn-up.

- 3) The dealer cannot pass a second time when naming the trump suit. On the second round, if the first three players pass, the dealer MUST name a suit (stick the dealer).
- 4) Whoever decides the trump suit, by accepting the turn-up or naming a trump in the second round, becomes the maker. The maker has the right to say, "I play alone," whereupon his partner must stay out.

E. Play

- 1) If the turned-up is accepted, dealer has the right to use it as of his hand, discarding any other card from his hand face down.
- 2) The opening lead is made by the player at left of the dealer, regardless of who is the maker.
- 3) The hands are played out in five tricks. A player must follow suit to a lead if able; if unable to follow suit, he may play any card. A trick is won by the highest trump in it, or, if it contains no trump by the highest card of the suit led. The winner of the trick leads to the next.

F. Scoring

- 1) Only the side that wins three or more tricks scores. Winning all five tricks is called march. When the making side fails to win the majority, it is said to be euchred.
- 2) The making side, when both are playing, scores 1 point for winning three or four tricks or 2 for march. A maker playing alone scores 1 for three or four tricks, or 4 for march.
- 3) Opponents of the maker, when both are playing, score 2 for euchre.

G. Game

- 1) The first side to reach 10 points wins a game.
- 2) One game will be played until consolation and final rounds which will be best two of three games.

H. Irregularities

- 1) New Deal. If a card is exposed or found faced in the pack during a deal, or if the deck is found to be incorrect, the dealer must deal again.
- 2) Wrong number of cards. If, before the first trick is completed, any hand is found to have the wrong number of cards, there must be a new deal by the same dealer. If the error is discovered at a later time, play continues and the offending side may not score for that deal.
- 3) Lead out of turn. If a player leads out of turn and the trick is gathered before the error is noticed, it stands as regular. Otherwise, the erroneous lead becomes an exposed card (left face up on the table and must be played at first legal opportunity) and other cards played to the trick may be retracted without penalty.
- 4) Exposed card. If a player (not playing alone) exposes a card from his hand except in proper play, he must leave it face up on the table and must play it at the first legal opportunity.
- 5) Illegal information. If a player looks at a quitted trick or gives illegal information to his partner, the opponent at the right of the leader may name the suit to be led at the next opportunity of the offending side to lead.
- 6) Coaching. Fans giving illegal information will result in the opponent at the right of the leader naming the suit to be led at the next opportunity of the offending side to lead.
- 7) Revoke. Failure to follow suit when able to do so is a revoke. A player may correct his revoke before the trick is gathered; otherwise it stands as established. For established revoke, the opponents of the offender may score 2 points or may deduct 2 from the revoking side (both playing) or 4 from a lone player.

1. A team should consist of 6 players. No team may play with fewer than 2 female/male on the floor at all times.
2. Players must alternate positions in the lineup.
3. Immediately after the serve and during all subsequent volleys, if a ball is hit more than once, one hit has to be by a female.
4. A block does not count as a hit.
5. Net height will be 7' 4 1/4".
6. Male players are not permitted to spike. (The ball must rise before it can fall, slight arch.)
7. All players may penetrate the net to block any offensive shot provided they allow the offensive team the opportunity to play the ball first. Back row players may not block at the net.
8. All serves by males must be underhand. Females may serve in any manner specified by USVBA rules.
9. Referees are instructed to call carries or illegal hitting of the ball as consistently as possible. It is strictly up to the judgment of the official.
10. Setting of the serve is permitted.
11. The serve **can** hit the net. There is no blocking of the serve.
12. Each team will get 2 time outs per game lasting 30 seconds each.
13. Qualified officials will referee all games.
14. Captains are responsible for seeing that teams are ready to begin play 15 minutes before their scheduled matches.
15. Starting time of all matches will be given a 5-minute grace period.
16. Teams must provide their own warm up balls.
17. A forfeit / scratch is equal to a 2 game win with the team awarded with 42 points, (21-0, 21-0).

American Softball Association rules govern play with the following additions:

1. Tournament Play: Format will be double elimination or **2 GAME GUARENTEE** (due to time constraints).
2. Starting the Game: The day of game roster must be received by registration table fifteen (15) minutes prior to the start of the game. The batting order must be in alternating order and be given to the umpire five (5) minutes prior to the starting time. Games must begin quickly and on time. Warm-ups will be permitted only if time permits. Teams arriving last will be denied warm-ups if it is time to start the game.
3. Each team will have a five (5) minute grace period to field a team of at least nine players, either 5 women & 4 men or 4 men & 5 women. If a team is not on the field at the end of the grace period, it will forfeit the game. Forfeits may put teams out of the tournament.
4. A Forfeit / Scratch results in a win plus a score of 7 - 0.
5. Rain Outs: Games in progress that are rained out will resume where play left off. When play resumes, the game will be played to its regular length of seven (7) innings. Games will continue in the same order and started at a later time that day if possible or moved to a different date. Team captains will be notified of an official rain out by the tournament director. It will also be put on the voice mail system at 224-1137, ext. 274.
6. Ending of the Game: The umpire will announce "No New Innings" at eight (8) minutes before the one (1) hour and ten (10) minute limit. If an inning has begun, it shall be continued until completed.
7. Sportsmanship: The umpire or the tournament director may remove any player who: smokes while actively playing, uses vulgar language, argues with the umpire beyond reason or possesses alcoholic beverages on the premises of the playing areas and parking lots. One (1) warning for unsportsmanlike conduct will be given to a player. A second display will result in the player being removed from the game. If he or she refuses to leave the field, their team will be forced to forfeit and the player asked to leave the playing grounds entirely.
8. Protests: The chief umpire and tournament director will make a ruling before the next pitch on matters involving rule misinterpretations. Judgment calls can't be formally protested.
9. Softballs will be provided by the YMCA and will be returned to the YMCA following the game.
10. Awards will be presented after the final game on Sunday.
11. Any fly ball hit over the fence is a home run. Any roll or bounce into these areas is a double. If a ball is caught on the fly in these areas, it will be counted as an out.
12. A ten (10) run lead after the fifth inning is a win.
13. The umpire's decision will be final. Coaches only are to talk with the umpires.
14. Speed-up rules will be used. Umpires will be instructed to begin play as soon as fielders are set. There will be no throwing the ball around the infield after an out.
15. The pitch must be delivered with perceptible arc of at least six (6) feet from the ground and cannot reach a height of more than twelve (12) feet from the ground.
16. NO METAL SPIKES ARE PERMITTED. Players may wear cleats, but they must be of one piece, molded to the sole.
17. Each batter will start will start with a count of one and one.

The batter will receive one free foul ball after attaining two strikes. The second foul ball after two strikes is an out.

18. Batting Order is alternating.

If any male is walked without receiving one strike to hit, he goes to first base and the following woman has her choice to walk or hit. If any male is walked with one strike, he goes to first and the woman has to hit. Each team has the option to bat ten (10) or twelve (12) players, but still may only field ten (10) players (5 men & 5 women), these ten players may play any position. When batting 9 players, the 10th position will be an out.

19. Home team, chosen by the flip of a coin or any other agreed upon methods, has the official score sheet and is responsible to turn it in to the tournament director.

STARTING GAMES AND SCORING

1. Teams must have at least four players to start (minimum two females) and on the court at all times.
1. A team earns service possession for the start of the first game by winning a coin toss or a Rock/Paper/Scissors. The teams will then alternate service every other game.
3. Teams will play the first 2 games to 21 with a cap at 25 (Rally Score). The 3rd game will be played to 15 with a cap of 17 (Rally Score). "Rally Score" means that every time a point is finished, one team will be awarded a point, whether they served or not.
4. Serves that hit the net and go over the net to the opponent's side will be "live" and are good serves provided the opposing team plays them or they land in bounds.

SERVICE AND ROTATION

1. Team members must rotate on the court and must remain in that position until the serve has been contacted. The player in the back right hand corner of the rotation will be designated to serve and continue to rotate clockwise.
2. The server may not step on or over the end line until the ball has been contacted. The width of the service area is from sideline to sideline. The depth of the service area is infinite.
3. The serve may not be blocked or spiked.
4. Players can return the serve by:
 - a. Bump pass
 - b. Clapping their hands together
 - c. A closed fist

PLAYING THE BALL

1. **THREE CONTACTS** - Each team is allowed a maximum of 3 successive contacts of the ball in order to return the ball to the opponent's area. (Exception: In the action of blocking an attacking ball, the touch, or contact resulting from the block attempt does not constitute one of the three successive contacts). There are no male/female hitting rules.
2. **ATTACKING THE NET** - Only the three players that are in the front row of the rotation are allowed to attack the net. Violation of this rule would include any hitting or blocking that occurs above the plane of the net.
3. **SIMULTANEOUS CONTACTS** - When two non-blocking teammates touch the ball simultaneously, it is considered one contact, and any player may make the next contact. When two blocking teammates touch the ball simultaneously, it is not counted as a contact, and any player may make the next contact. When two opponents simultaneously and instantaneously contact the ball over the net, and the ball remains in play, the team receiving the ball is entitled to another three hits. If such a ball lands "out", it is the fault of the team on the opposite side of the net from where the ball lands.
4. **CHARACTERISTICS OF THE CONTACT** - The ball can contact any number of body parts down to, and including the foot, providing such contacts are simultaneous and the ball rebounds immediately and cleanly after such contact.
5. **HELD BALL** - The ball must be contacted cleanly and not held, lifted, pushed, caught, carried or thrown. The ball cannot roll or come to rest on any part of a player's body. It can rebound in any direction.
6. **HAND SETS** - A contact of the ball using the fingers of one or two hands to direct the ball toward a teammate is a set. The ball must come into contact with both hands simultaneously and leave both hands simultaneously to avoid a double hit call.

7. **ATTACKING THE BALL OVER THE OPPONENTS COURT**- A player is not allowed to attack the ball on the opposite side of the net. If the ball is hit above the spiker's side of the net and then the follow-through causes the spiker's hand and arm to cross the net without contacting an opponent or the net, the action does not constitute a fault.

BLOCKING

1. Blocking is the action close to the net which intercepts the ball coming from the opponents' side by making contact with the ball before, during or after it crosses the net.
2. **MULTIPLE CONTACTS** - Multiple contacts of the ball by a player(s) participating in a block shall be legal provided it is during one attempt to intercept the ball. Multiple contacts of the ball during a block shall be counted as a single contact, even though the ball may make multiple contacts with one or more players of the block.
3. **PARTICIPATION AFTER A BLOCK** - Any player participating in a block shall have the right to make the next contact, such contact counting as the first of three hits allowed the team.
4. **BLOCKING A SERVE** - Blocking or attacking a serve is prohibited.
5. **BLOCKING A BALL ACROSS THE NET** - Blocking of the ball across the net above the opponent's court shall be legal provided that such a block is:
 - a. After a player of the attacking team has spiked the ball, or, in the referee's judgment, intentionally directed the ball into the opponent's court, or has exhausted their third allowable hit.
 - b. After the opponents' have hit the ball in such a manner that the ball would clearly cross the net if not touched by a player, provided no member of the attacking team is in a position to make a legal play on the ball
 - c. If the ball is falling near the net and no member of the attacking team could reasonably make a play on the ball.

PLAY AT THE NET

1. **PLAYER CONTACT WITH THE NET** - No part of the body may touch the net at any time unless a ball or person driven into the net causes the contact. Player contact with the net in a manner not directly relating to or affecting the course of play is not a violation. Contact with hair or part of the uniform will not be considered a fault.
2. **SIMULTANEOUS CONTACT BY OPPONENTS** - If opponents contact the net simultaneously, it shall constitute a double fault and the point shall be played over.
3. **INTERFERENCE** - Beach volleyball allows any and all parts of the body to cross the center line as long as there is no interference with the opposing player.

1) The Playing Field

- The kickball diamond is a square with equal sides of 60 feet
- The pitching strip is at the center of the diamond (directly aligned on the first and third base diagonal)
- The strike zone extends to one foot on either side of home plate

2) Teams/Captains/Rosters

- Teams consist of 10 players with 5 males and 5 females. If a team cannot alternate the kicking lineup then an out will be taken.
- Each team has a Captain (or Co-Captains) who will be responsible for said team.
- The captains must ensure that:
 - a. Their team kicks in a written order alternating male, female or female, male if not an out is taken.
 - b. All present team members kick before the top of the order
 - c. Their team plays with sportsmanship, respect and candor
 - d. Only the captain and co-captain may dispute calls made by the referees
 - e. All disputed calls will be appealed to the Head Referee only

4) Kicking/At the Plate

- All kicks must be made by foot

 - a. All bunts count as both one (1) strike and one (1) foul ball

5) Fouls

- A foul kick is called as followed:
 - a. Any kick landing out of bounds
 - b. Any kick landing in bounds and traveling out of bounds before reaching the bases
 - c. Any kick not traveling past home plate

6) Pitching/Catching

- The pitcher must roll the ball smoothly to home plate (No "Bouncies").
- A "Bouncie" will be re-rolled (it will not count as a strike or ball).
- All pitches must be rolled at a reasonable speed.
- The pitcher must stay behind the pitching strip until the ball is kicked.
- All pitches will be rolled to a catcher (positioned directly behind the kicker).

- No player may advance forward of the pitching strip until the ball has been kicked.
- The play stops once the ball is in the pitchers hands. Runners cannot advance until the next pitch.
- Strikes: A strike is a pitch rolled within the strike zone not kicked (or missed) by the kicker.
- Balls
 - A pitch outside of the strike zone
 - A fielder moving towards home plate before the ball is kicked

7) Outs

- Outs are called as followed:
 - a. Three strikes or four foul kicks per "at bat"
 - b. A runner touched or hit by the ball after a kick
 - c. A runner touched or hit by the ball while running the bases
 - d. A runner who touches the ball at any time the ball is in play
 - e. A ball tag on the base to which a runner is forced to run and does not
 - f. A runner caught off of the base before the ball is kicked
 - g. Any kicked ball (fair or foul) caught before it hits the ground

8) Running: On the Bases

- Runners must stay within base line (Fielders must try to stay out of baseline).
- Runners hindered by fielders within the base line will be called safe.
- Blocking of the bases is not permitted. Called blocks result in a safe call.
- All "ties" or "close calls" are awarded to the runner.
- No leading off or stealing bases is allowed.
- Runners must have at least one foot on base until the ball is kicked.
- Runners struck in the head or neck with ball will be ruled safe.
- If the runner intentionally uses his/her head to block ball, the runner will be called out.
- Runners may over run first base.
- Runners may not pass another runner while on the base pad.
- Intentional sliding is not permitted and will result in an automatic out.

9) Player Conduct

- Referees may eject any player for unsportsmanlike conduct or unruly behavior.
- Players will receive one (1) official warning, the second results in an ejection.

1. Initial matches shall play a 9 game pro-set, no-ad scoring, and a 12-point tiebreaker at 8 games each.
2. No-ad scoring means that a game is won when a team wins 4 points; there is no deuce/ad. If the score is tied at 3 points each, the receiving team shall pick either side to receive the final point.
3. If the games are tied at 8 games each, a 12-point tiebreaker shall decide the match. A tiebreaker begins by having the next regular server serve one point to the deuce court. The serve then goes through the regular rotation with each player serving one point to the ad court, followed by one serve to the deuce court. Switch sides after every 6 points have been played. The game and match are over when one team reaches 7 points. But, you must win the tiebreaker by 2 points.
4. A racquet spin or the toss of a coin shall start each match. Winner shall chose to either serve or receive. During any set, always switch sides after the odd numbered games.
5. Players are responsible for making their own calls. If you are unsure of a call, THE BALL IS IN. A line judge can be appointed in the event of a break down in sportsmanship.

10. A safety and training session will take place before play begins.
11. What to Wear:

1. A team will consist of any four employees. Men's Singles, Women's singles and **Choice doubles** team will comprise a team entry.
2. The individual scores after 25 innings (50 shoes) will be added together for a team score or **(tba)**.
3. Pitching extra innings shall break a tie. The tie will be considered broken after the first inning that one total score is higher than the opponents.
4. The pitching distance for men shall be 40 feet and for women 30 feet (10 feet in front of the men's foul line, parallel to and the width of the men's platform).
5. Any shoe pitched while the pitcher's foot extends on or over the foul line shall be declared foul and removed from the counting distance.
6. In pitching the shoe, the pitcher shall stand on the pitchers' platform, at one side or the other of the stake.
7. In delivering a shoe, the pitcher must remain behind the foul line until the shoe has left his/her hand.
8. No contestant, while opponent is in pitching position, shall make any remark, or utter sounds within hearing of the opponent. There will be no movement that might interfere with the opponents' playing.
9. Two warnings will be provided for unsportsmanlike conduct as outlined in #8. The third offense will automatically be a forfeit.
10. Choice of first pitch, or follow, shall be determined by the toss of a coin or as flipped-up shoe.
11. A contestant must pitch their second shoe from the same side of the approach as their first shoe. A contestant may pitch their shoe from the approach side of their choice during any inning of the match, as long as they are both pitched from the same side.
12. Measurements to determine points shall be made with a straight edge.
13. Players shall alternate first pitch, one player having first pitch in the even innings and the other player in the odd.
14. Each player shall receive credit for all points according to the position of their shoes at the end of each inning. Thus, it is possible for each player to score six points in any one inning. Ringers count three points and shoes within six inches of the stake count one point each.
15. Scorekeepers will be keeping team scores at each pit.
16. Any discrepancies must be reported at the time of the throw to the tournament official.
17. All shoes property of the YMCA must be returned to the director after the competition ends.
