


Recreational Facility Attitudes

Three-in-four are satisfied with existing Parks and Recreation facilities. More than two-in-third disagree they would support a new community center at the risk of harming existing businesses, clubs and services.



Tax Attitudes

Three-in-five residents indicate a level of tax sensitivity. A similar share disagree that a new community center is vitally important, with nearly half strongly disagreeing.





How a Community Center Ballot Issue Fares


Initial Measure Vote

Nearly three-fifths of voters oppose building a new community center initially.

In a future election, there may be a measure on the ballot to fund a new community center in Grove City. This new city-owned facility could potentially include amenities like an indoor running track, indoor pools, a fitness center, multi-purpose courts, and multi-purpose spaces for arts and culinary demonstrations.


The new community center is expected to cost the city approximately \$80 to \$90 million to build, which will likely require the city to raise additional revenue through new taxes.

Initial Measure Vote by Subgroups

Support for the plan is highly partisan, with higher Democratic support but opposition from roughly two-in-three Republican and Independent voters. Younger voters are more open to the plan than voters over 50.






How Voters View a YMCA Alternative

Support for YMCA Alternative

After only a brief description, three-in-four support the YMCA's alternative proposal. A majority of all key subgroups support the alternative proposal, especially those initially supportive of a new Community Center.

As you may know, the Grove City YMCA has proposed an alternative to the City's plan, which would call for a partnership between the City and the Y to expand and upgrade the Grove City Y with new amenities, and which would cost roughly half of the cost of the City's current proposal.
